

This coming year, we have a great variety of summer camp options being hosted at Mingus Mountain Methodist Camp and Retreat Center (outside of Prescott, AZ) and Potosi Pines Methodist Camp (outside of Las Vegas, NV). Among our many options for camp this summer are several exciting and/or new opportunities. These include:

Younger Elementary Camps, for children in Kindergarten through 3rd grade, are offered at each camp site. At Potosi, campers get their first taste of what overnight camp without mom and dad will be like; at Mingus, parent(s) stay the nights with their child(ren), experiencing camp side-by-side with their little campers.


Senior High Leadership Camp is a new experience at Mingus Mountain this coming summer. A small camp of 14 youth will work with adults to learn and grow as leaders, integrating service with other children with lessons on leadership from the Disney Leadership Institute.

Adventure Camps, for both Middle and High School Youth, are back this summer at Potosi Pines. Over the course of these weeks, campers engage in hiking, cooking outdoors, and more!

Horse Camp (at Mingus) returns for its second year! Elementary and Middle School aged youth, entering grades 5 through 8, are invited to join us for a week of camp that includes introductions to horsemanship including horse care and riding.

Camp Bus to Mingus Mountain!

This summer, transportation to Mingus Mountain Camp will be offered on the camp bus.

The bus will pick up campers in the Tucson area at 9:30 am the day of camp at Catalina United Methodist Church (2700 E. Speedway Blvd, Tucson, AZ 85716). The bus will continue to the Phoenix area and pick up campers at 12:00 pm at the United Methodist Center (1550 E. Meadow-brook Ave, Phoenix, AZ 85014), then continue to Mingus Mountain.

The bus will leave Mingus Mountain at the close of camp and reach the United Methodist Center in Phoenix at 12:00pm, then continue to Tucson, arriving at Catalina United Methodist Church at 2:30pm.

The cost for each one way bus ride to or from camp is \$25. Space on the bus is limited – register soon to reserve your seat.

Don't Forget to Breathe!

After two shoulder surgeries and progressive arthritis within my rotator cuff, my orthopedic surgeon informed me my shoulder was beyond repair. At first, I was depressed. But then I asked if there were any other possible treatments that might help minimize the pain. The doctor suggested a couple months of physical therapy. I agreed to give it a try. On the first day, the physical therapist had me doing a few stretches and strengthening exercises. It all seemed routine and easy. But then he had me lie down on a padded bench, so he could assess and stretch the muscles in my shoulder. At first, the manipulation was painless. But when he would move my arm into positions it was not willing to go he would smile and say, "Don't forget to breathe!" The pain was almost unbearable and my arm would literally bounce... and he would smile and say, "You're doing great!" Breathing became the greatest pain relief I could get during those stretching sessions, and after a few weeks of what seemed like torture, my shoulder pain lessened and my range of motion improved.

If taken it seriously, the season of Lent can be a painful time of self examination. In the small group study Restored: Finding Redemption in Our Mess, Tom Berlin reminds us that until we admit the sin (the messes) in our lives, we cannot experience forgiveness and restoration. Revealing the broken areas of our lives to God and one another may be painful, perhaps even frightening, but the outcome will be good for us and those we love. God will "stretch" us in some new and wonderful ways. Not unlike physical therapy, the success of what God is able to do in our lives will depend on us breathing in God's grace. This is Resurrection! Don't forget to breathe!

Notes from Church Council

Last month, we briefly covered the nurture ministries in our church. Remember the acronym N.O.W.? “N” stood for nurture and our nurture ministries, such as worship, Sunday School, small group Bible studies, summer camp, and Vacation Bible School. These are some of the ways we learn to love God.

In the acronym N.O.W., O stands for Outreach. These ministries help us to love others. We have numerous outreach opportunities at our church! We support our Missions Team and the outreach opportunities they provide—serving meals at the UMOM Watkins Shelter and the annual Shoebox Christmas ministry. Our Riner Outreach Center helps people in our community with food and utility assistance. Your donations of food, clothing and money make a big difference for many families in Glendale and our neighboring communities. Another outreach ministry is our Wednesday Open Worship (WOW). This ministry provides a worship opportunity and a hot meal for folks in the middle of the week. Our Church & Society Team hosts monthly meetings with other agencies and non-profits (NEIGHBOR), coordinating available resources to help people and to encourage our government entities to partner with non-profits to make a difference. We pay our monthly apportionments to our conference and these dollars help support the global ministries of the United Methodist Church. We help support missionaries, universities and hospitals and provide disaster relief—we are the hands and feet of God when people need help. Meeting new people and giving a helping hand helps us follow God’s commandment to love others.



Our working outreach teams, Missions, Riner, WOW, Church & Society all need volunteers to do their important work. These teams meet monthly to plan their outreach programs but they need folks like you and me to help, too. Can you spare 2-3 hours on a Sunday afternoon to help cook a meal for 125 folks at the Watkins Shelter or a few hours to go to the shelter and serve the food we prepared? Can you come help make sandwiches on Tuesday or Thursday for the Riner Center, or help put groceries away in the food pantry? Our Wednesday Open Worship needs help with meal preparation. Or perhaps you’d like to join the NEIGHBOR group working with others to try to help the less fortunate in our community.

We need people willing to give their time and talents to make a difference for others. Maybe you’d like to participate in a work day at a local food bank; maybe we could put a team together to help paint a house in an older neighborhood when Glendale celebrates “Make a Difference” Day. Where can we include you in our efforts to help others?
