On Sunday, February 3, 1929, people came to the little farming community of Glendale from near and far to celebrate the dedication of a beautiful new house of worship in the center of their town. On Sunday, February 3, 2019, we will gather again to celebrate the 90th birthday of the sanctuary and re-dedicate it to the glory of God's work. Our resident Bishop Robert T. Hoshibata will preach at the morning services and lead us in the re-dedication. Following the 9:00 am service, there will be a reception in Fellowship Hall to honor the occasion and we encourage those who normally attend the 11:11 am service to come early for refreshments and fellowship.



This month, over 150 million Americans will tune in to the big game! There will be parties with abundant food, friendship and fellowship. At the same time, there will be people worrying about staying warm, finding shelter and a warm meal.

This is our opportunity to remember and lift up various African American leaders who have advanced our country and world with their gifts of leadership, talent and service. I hope that each of us will take advantage of the many opportunities in this month, and as we do, give thanks to God who continues to call us into the future. I am grateful for you and pledge myself in the ministry of Christ in the coming months of 2019.

Mingus Mountain Camp will offer the first ever Winter Family Camp February 16-18, 2019 (President's Day Weekend). Bring your family and friends to experience a touch of the winter season, enjoying a starry night sky or the warmth of a crackling fireplace during cold evenings among the great ponderosa pines of northern Arizona.

For this event, registration begins by reserving one of our rooms, and then registering the number of people attending. Families can reserve a room for themselves, or may choose to join with friends and share a cabin or a retreat room (providing one family completes the registration process for all individuals):

**\$160 - Retreat Cabin Room:** Each retreat cabin has indoor bathrooms and six rooms. Each room has five beds (two bunk beds and one single) and reserve for \$160 for the two nights.

**\$150 - Rustic Cabin:** Rustic Cabins are heated, individual cabins with 9 beds (4 bunk beds and one single) each, but do not have indoor bathrooms. (Bathroom facilities exist at LaPointe Hall and the Dining Hall.) Plus the per person charge to cover the cost of the six meals provided during the weekend: 18+: \$30; 5-17: \$20; <4: free

(So, for example, a family of four can join us for the weekend for \$260 (\$160 + 2x\$30 + 2x\$20); or two families can register together to share a Rustic Cabin and join us for less!)

#### **Behavioral Health – Caring for Others/Caring for Ourselves – Rev. Joshua Warner \*\***

Mental health is important. It affects how we feel, act, deal with stress and relate to others. Our Wesleyan heritage calls us to take care of our whole being including our physical, spiritual, and emotional well-being. ## ***Update from the Finance Committee: Year End Results, New Chairman***

In December, members and friends of First Glendale generously donated \$52,949 to support the operation and programs of our church. This is \$16,700 more than our November donations. This includes money received for the Riner Assistance Office, Capital Improvements, Missions, Staff Christmas gifts, and other designated funds. Your generous stewardship enabled our church to fully support the connected Methodist church throughout the world by making all 12 apportionment payments for 2018.

For the entire year 2018, income from all sources (including, for example, rental income) totaled \$475,397. Total expenses totaled \$458,761 which includes \$51,914 spent for apportionments and \$95,158 spent by the various designated funds (again the Riner Assistance Office, Capital Improvements, Missions, Camp Scholarships, Flowers, WOW, Heifer Project, UMCOR, Youth, Glendale Glitters, the Staff Christmas gifts, and a few others). As you can see, with revenues and expenses near the half million mark, FUMC is a large and somewhat complicated organization, served by Pastor Kim, seven part-time staff, and a plethora of volunteers. It takes a lot of work by a lot of people to keep the gears turning and the expenses paid. Thank you to everyone who volunteers to keep our church going and growing.

From a financial point of view any year which ends with a positive balance is a great year. The year of 2018 was a great year! Doing the math, we ended with a positive \$16,636. Roughly \$10,600 was kept in the general fund to give January a good start, and the remainder was held amongst the various designated funds.

Looking ahead to 2019: Our stewardship campaign is completed. The amount pledged is about the same as in 2018, but a handful of 2018 pledgers did not turn in pledge cards for 2019. Nevertheless, we expect those members to continue their support of the church. The Desert Southwest Conference meanwhile, using a formula that looks back at how well we did in 2017, raised our apportionments for 2019. Also, by the time you read this, we will have adopted the 2019 budget for the general fund. (The general fund usual represents about 80% of all revenues and expenditures.) Next month I will highlight the 2019 budget.

Although I have worked on the financial side for many years, this is my first year as chairman of the Finance Committee. Ted Turner, the Finance chair for the last three years, has set a very high bar for anyone succeeding him. I hope I can fill his shoes, and serve as well as he did. My own personal philosophy is to give out “too much” information. This is your church, and you have the right to know how we are doing financially at any time. So, if you have any questions regarding the finances of the church, I strongly encourage you to ask. You will get your answer.

May GOD continue to guide and bless our church.
