
As we step into the season of love and light, may we hold tight to the truth that love saves us.

We welcome you to visit or become an active member of the Mission Committee. We meet on the third Thursday of the month in Fellowship Hall, at 6:30 pm.









#### Update from the Finance Committee

In October, members and friends of First Glendale generously donated \$38,790 (slightly higher than September donations of \$34,615) to support the operation and programs of our church. This total includes money received for the General Fund, the Riner Assistance Office, Capital Improvements, Brick-by-Brick, Memorial Fund, Missions Fund, Centennial Fund, UMCOR, and other designated funds. Due primarily to lower expenses and the increased donations we ended the month on the positive side of the ledger again. Due to this positive balance, we were able to pay our apportionment payment in November (that's 5 out of 11 payments). Traditionally, November and December are our two highest giving months, so I expect we will be able to make one or more apportionment payments in December although it seems unlikely we will be able to fully pay our 2019 apportionments.

The electric bills are moving in the right direction again, i.e., lower (although still a bit too high for my taste). Our solar panel production is also increasing. We are still waiting on the Trustees to explain the discrepancy between what APS' customer support department says and what our monthly bills say about our solar panel production.

By the time you read this, our Fall Stewardship campaign, "Embracing the Future," will be over. Thank you to everyone who submitted a pledge card. Without your support, it would be impossible to plan a budget for 2020. Your generosity not only supports this church, but also brings you a personal sense of contentment and happiness.

As I write this, the Finance committee is deep into producing a budget for next year. Our final budget won't be completed until the end of December (after we have received all of our pledges), but we had to have something prepared for our 2019 charge conference.

This is your church, and you have the right to know how we are doing financially at any time. So, if you have any questions, no matter how big or how small, regarding the budget or finances of the church, I strongly encourage you to ask. You will get your answer.

May God continue to guide and bless our church.


Watch your Sunday bulletin folder for the Christmas poinsettia order form. The cost is \$10.00 per plant.
