I was in my father's home going through some of his papers after his passing, and I was looking around, at all the books, artwork, photographs, mementos, and other items that surrounded me. I knew that all these items would need to be dispersed, moved or sent to other locations, and I suddenly realized that I really, really didn't want to do that. I didn't want to disassemble my father's home, taking apart all the things he had assembled over the decades, things that he had acquired, created, or kept because they meant something to him. They were things that were a part of his history, things that made his surroundings feel like home for him. It was another part of coming to terms with the loss of my father, realizing that this place, where we had

And I realized that many of the items in my father's home will bring similar joy to younger generations of our family, and to my father's friends. And I knew that that is what my father would want.

Update from the Finance Subcommittee

In January, members and friends of First Glendale generously donated \$31,233 (down about \$45,000 from our December donations of \$76,826) to support the operation and programs of our church. This total includes money received for the General Fund, the Riner Assistance Office, Capital Improvements, Brick-by-Brick, and other designated funds as well as interest and increases to our TD Ameritrade investment account. Focusing on the General Fund, we had income of \$27,501 and expenses of \$18,616. Our income exceeded our expenses by about \$9,000 for the month. The balance in our checking account accordingly increased to \$40,293.

The January donations were down from December (when General Fund donations reached \$46,763), but December is always a big month for the church. The January donations were more than adequate to cover our monthly expenses. This was helped in part by the Desert Southwest Conference forgiving the January apportionment payment (a \$3,410 savings). In January both pledged and unpledged giving exceeded the budget for those categories. All in all, it was a good month, and the church is in a healthy financial position.

At the moment the only cloud is the resignation of Rebecca Curless as our office administrator. Rebecca kept the financial wheels turning at the church, and she will be sorely missed by everyone dealing with the finances of the church. We wish her luck in her new position.

This is your church, and you have the right to know how we are doing financially at any time. So, if you have any questions, no matter how big or how small, regarding the budget or finances of the church, I strongly encourage you to ask. You will get your answer.

May God continue to guide and bless our church.
