Celebrating a Birthday

"When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. ² And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³ Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. - Acts 2:1-4

As April transitions to May, the warmer months of Summer are almost upon us. And here at First Glendale, and in virtually every other Christian congregation around the world, the month of May will bring the day of Pentecost, the occasion when we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit to Jesus' followers gathered in Jerusalem, shortly after Jesus' resurrection and ascension. The day of Pentecost marks one of the most important milestones

in the history of the Christian faith. Although there already was a growing group of Jesus' followers after His resurrection, Acts 2 describes how the Holy Spirit came as "Tongues of fire" to those of all nations in Jerusalem, enabling them to hear and understand God's message to them in their own languages. Peter then exhorted those gathered to be baptized in the name of Christ and receive the Holy Spirit, and

approximately three thousand people did so that day, marking what is considered to be the birth of the Christian Church.

When we celebrate a birthday in our families or with friends, we want to have a joyous celebration, and we usually do so for one or more of these reasons: 1. We want to remember and celebrate the occasion of their birth, and what a gift




May Report - Church Council Activities

Who knew that the ultimate word on 'teamwork" is referenced in the Bible? As we all know, it's always good to have a backup and/or a team member who can step up to assist when needed. Thankfully, our Church Council is just such the team! It's depth of knowledge, talent and engaging dialogue always enrich decisions to ensure Glendale First United continues to meet its mission. We are blessed with many who have unique talents. Here is your May update on its recent Meeting -

The first quarter (January – March) Finance Report was conducted and again, with the exception of a few items, the overall scenario was positive. It is important to note that the quarterly report did not reflect a needed and approximate \$84,000 transfer from our investment account into our operating account. Hence, expenses for the current "Brick by Brick" project in March created an "out of balance" operating fund for March. Rest assured; by the time you receive this, the available funds will have been transferred and expenses covered. There were a few other categories in the detail report such as capital expenses, subscriptions, etc., that the Finance Committee will keep its eye on as we continue through the year. Again, feel free to ask any



questions as to where or how your financial contributions are being used by the church or any of the detail. Your contributions do make a huge difference and they are very appreciated!

- We did have various committee reports...the Trustees shared information on various improvements made to the campus i.e. new railings, door handles, pigeon control at the mechanical room, and various inspection related items to the Brick by Brick project...speaking of which, all work related to this massive project is on track and doing well the church stabilization is complete, brickwork is being repaired, painting has occurred, new railings have been installed, and the front door to the Sanctuary is being refurbished. Work will continue but is beginning to wind down...the Outreach and Hospitality Committee reviewed the great success of the March Family Fund time event and is planning another family fun "evening" type of event for May.
- A proposed three-month calendar of events for Glendale FUMC was reviewed and approved. All in attendance
 were asked to submit any changes for the balance of April and the months of May June. It is the intent to
 have this calendar shared with Church membership to provide everyone with a "look down the road"
 regarding chur activities.
- o If he looks a little frazzled...over the past month, Pastor Jelinek reported that he spent a total of 26 days in ministry and performed 95 different functions such as scripting all sermons, creating PowerPoint slides, preparing church bulletins, attended the WOW services, and conducting several pastoral calls (visits). He expressed his gratitude and thanks to all who participated in Holy Week and Easter Sunday. He further indicated that in late April to early May, he will be attending the General UMC Conference in Tucson, and it will also be live-streamed.
